

DR. GEORGE H. BROWN (PHS 1926)

After the Green Bay native graduated from Portage High School in 1926, Dr. Brown received bachelors, masters and doctorate degrees in electrical engineering from the University of Wisconsin. Dr. Brown then moved to Camden, NJ where he eventually became Vice President of RCA. While there, Dr. Brown worked on the development of the color television and better radio antennas. During his career he was awarded 80 patents and published over 100 technical papers before his death in 1987.
