### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The Greater Portage Youth Education Foundation started 2018 with the declaration that "we can do more". Our hope was to become more active in issuing grants that were focused on education-based activities and projects while still serving those we have supported in the past.

Using that declaration as a measuring stick, 2018 was a successful year for GPYEF! We approved nearly \$17,000 in grants and scholarships last year which marks the greatest financial commitment we have made in over 5 years! And the types of grants we issued are even more exciting. We provided funding to such educational projects as the Google Expedition Project, the Spanish and German Exchange Programs, HOSA and Partners in Education (PIE), among others. All in all, 2018 was a good start to our stated goal.

And yet we could have done even more! But due to budgetary constraints we had to limit the amount of our grants for several requests, or deny the request entirely. So our goal for 2019 is to find ways to increase our donation income so we don't have to turn anyone away. That's a tall order because Portage has so many worthy causes competing for the same dollar. But we are committed to finding a way because the donations we receive from the community have such a positive impact on our students.

We have a lot to look forward to in 2019. We welcomed Krista Escobedo last year as a new board member and are looking forward to her continued contributions in 2019. We will be introducing a new scholarship in 2019 thanks to a generous benefactor and we will be inducting a new class into the Portage High School Hall of Fame in June.

Our many thanks go to all who support GPYEF. Our board of directors is a special group who volunteer their time and effort as we do our best to provide our teachers and students with the tools they need to succeed. And GPYEF gets a tremendous amount of support from Superintendent Margaret Rudolph, Suzi Hemler and the entire Portage School District. And obviously we don't even exist if not for the support of the Portage community so a huge "Thank You" to all our supporters!

# MORE HALL OF FAMERS ON THE WAY!

This June the Greater Portage Youth Education Foundation will be welcoming another group of extraordinary people into the PHS Hall of Fame! Every two years, the Hall of Fame committee chooses another class of inductees to enter the PHS Hall of Fame. The inductees will be honored at a banquet to be held at Dino's Restaurant on June 29, 2019. Earlier that day, GPYEF will sponsor the Hall of Fame golf outing as part of the festivities.

Nominations for the Hall of Fame will be accepted until March 1, 2019 and the new class of inductees will be announced shortly thereafter. All nominations are kept on file permanently so past nominees are still considered as part of the selection process. ### **FANTASTIC VOYAGES!**

Imagine a field trip to ancient Egypt? Or how about visiting a Jamestown settlement as it was during the Revolutionary War? Or traveling through the human body to examine how our nervous system functions?

These are just some of the "trips" taken by students at Wayne Bartels Middle School using the new Google Expeditions program (proudly sponsored by GPYEF). Using special Google goggles and a wide variety of platforms to choose from, students are able to embark on virtual reality field trips from the Caribbean Sea to the North Pole. The technology allows teachers to target an expedition that proves vital in helping students experience and understand course content.

Social Studies is a natural focus for the Google project as it uniquely provides students opportunities to view historical places and people. But the project is also used in science, agriculture, health and business classes as well. With over 400 views through December, the goal is to reach over 1,000 views by the end of the 2018-2019 schoolyear.

The project is also looking to expand with a local flavor. Using a special 360° camera that has yet to be purchased, the Google program allows teachers and students to create their own expeditions. The local expeditions can then be submitted to the WiscoVR program for the entire state to view.
